Make a Joyful Noise

Psalms 100:1 – "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth!"

What does your joyful noise sound like?

Maybe it's a hymn you've sung so many times the words live in your bones. Maybe it's the clatter of dishes after a potluck, or the hum of conversation that spills out of the fellowship hall long after the coffee is gone. Maybe it's a child's laugh echoing off the sanctuary walls at exactly the wrong moment and I think if we are honest, sometimes their voices arrive at exactly the right moment.

Psalms 100 doesn't ask for a perfect noise. It asks for a joyful one.

Paying attention to this difference matters. Choirs hit wrong notes. Prayers come out tangled. We show up tired, distracted, carrying more than we let on. And still, God invites us to make noise. We are asked to bring whatever we have, lift it up, and trust that it is enough. More than enough. It is worship.

This is, I think, one of the great gifts of community. We don't have to make our noise alone. The shy voice is steadied by the strong one beside it. The grief that has gone quiet finds itself surrounded by songs it had forgotten. The newcomer learns the words by watching the person in the next pew mouth them with their whole heart.

Together, our noise becomes something larger than any of us could produce on our own. We aren't singing a solo, we are a chorus, all the earth, raising our voice in common praise.

So whatever your noise is — bring it. The off-key hymn, the quiet prayer, the rattle of a walker, the cheerful chaos of children, the faithful presence of someone who simply shows up.

It all counts. It all matters. It is all heard.

Make your joyful noise. We need every part of it.

Deacon Jessie

A few weeks ago in Sunday School, we read a story from the book of Acts about the early Christians. Specifically, we read this section from Acts 2:44-47:

“All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.”

I’ve been thinking a lot about this passage, especially as we approach Easter. Easter is a holiday celebrating life and new birth. Jesus rises from the dead and is alive again! In the same way, through our baptisms and our faith in the risen Christ, we enter into new life.

But while we hear the phrase “new life” all the time, I don’t think we dwell in it long enough to truly understand the implications of what this truly means.

This is where the apostles and the early Christians can shed some light. These were the first people to believe in Christ as the crucified Messiah who, 3 days later, rose from the dead, and 40 days after that, ascended into Heaven. Many of these people knew Jesus and witnessed what happened firsthand. From this passage, we see that new life is actually fairly simple: new life means creating loving community. It means forming a group of those who love each other deeply, and because of that love, we give to all who have need. So, if you had excess food, instead of saving it for yourself, you’d give it away to someone who had none. If you had excess clothing and your neighbor didn’t have any, you’d share. All people’s needs were met because the community of believers came together to ensure such a thing was possible. Their mindset changed: their world was no longer about themselves, but about serving others. Instead of asking “What’s in it for me?”, these early Christians asked, “how can I be a better neighbor?” And their community flourished because of it.

In this Easter season, I wonder if we can ask the same of ourselves and our own community. What if the “new life” that Jesus calls us into is one where we create a community of reciprocity rather than selfishness? It is tempting to read passages like Acts 2 and think of it as some far-fetched idealistic world—something that could never happen today, right?! But I don’t think it is as far-fetched as we might think. I think our world is capable of such a change. We have the capacity to care for our neighbor and share what we have. We are capable of thinking beyond our own needs and extending a hand to others who do not have the resources we may have. Just like the apostles, we are called to share all we have with a glad and generous heart.

Blessings as you explore your own call to new life this Easter season.

- \$5,000 below budget as of the end of February
- \$35,000 yet needed to meet Kitchen Remodel Campaign goal
- Overall spending aligns with budget. Maintenance and administration are slightly over due to one-time/yearly purchases. Staff spending is responsible.
- Recommendation to provide monthly heating cost comparisons to prior year (month vs. prior month vs. prior year) for transparency. Full comparison spreadsheets can be made available, and a quarterly Council review was proposed.

Food For Backpacks (Doreen Pontow for Dave Drommerhausen):

- The last shipments for 2025-26 school year has been delivered and paid for
- Program received a generous donation from the Albert Lea Moose Lodge

Kitchen Remodel & Fundraiser (Pastor Shane):

- Expected completion by Easter (April 5)
- Council toured the kitchen to view remodeling progress
 - Drywall work done; kitchen painted
 - Recessed lights installed; many electric outlets added
 - Two serving windows consolidated to one wider, taller opening
 - Cabinets installed, drawers coming (made by Steve Schulz); doors and drawers are soft-close
 - Countertops are quartz; expected installation on or about March 20
 - Stovetop on site to be installed; hood installed today
 - Ice machine on site to be installed
 - Refrigerator and coffee station will remain on west wall 1
 - Freezers will move to storage room on north wall
 - Still searching for a large dining/eat-in table for the kitchen
- A new air conditioning unit will serve the kitchen, Youth Room, and Chapel
- Painting of the upstairs and downstairs hallways as well as new flooring in downstairs hallways will take place after Easter
